Report

That in pursuance of the special reference to them at the last stated meeting of the Board of the question of the adequacy of the Building Fund to the purpose of constructing and putting up a new fireproof building sufficient to hold ~~enough~~ of the collections of the library as it may be desirable to separate from those deposited which will be placed in the building belonging to the Ridgeay Branch, under the direction of Dr. Bush, they have consulted with two ~~very~~ <sup>experienced</sup> Competent Architects on this point ~~Preston & Weller~~ and ~~Weller~~, and have obtained from them estimates which though rough are approximate enough to enable the Committee to form and the Board to form an intelligent judgment in the matter.

The present amount of the Building Fund is about \$49,377 exclusive of the value of the lot at the corner of Locust and Juniper Street as will appear by the Schedule hereto annexed thereto.

Assuming the erection of the building to proceed with all reasonable dispatch, it would require a period of time during which the accumulation of interest may be safely assumed to be about six percent, which would bring the fund up to \$52,000.
