Deed Poll. John Budd to Jno. Carpenter.

Reciting that Thos. Fairman by Ind. dated 30 Dec. 1701 granted to said John Budd a certain part of his lot of land situated on the Southerly side of High Street between 2nd + 3rd Streets from the Delaware in the City of Phila. containing in breadth fronting the said High Street 66 feet and in length 306 feet. Bounded Northward with High Street. Eastward with the other part of same lot sold to one John McComes, of Phila. Southward with the back of Chestnut Street lots and to the Westward with Jacob Isaac's lot.

And further that said John Budd with consent of his neighbour the said John McComes who brought the other half lot had laid out an alley of 20 feet wide to extend from High Street to the back end of their lots equally between them.

And said Budd by this Deed Poll now in recital grants to said Jno. Carpenter all the remainder of his said John Budd's High Street lot situated butted and bounded as above the said piece is in breadth fronting the said 20 foot (laid out between John McComes and John Budd) for an alley 18 foot more or less and in depth 56 foot. Bounded N. with part of the same lot sold to one Adam Lewis. E. with said 20 foot alley. S. with the back of Chestnut Street lots and W. with part of that lot late James Blaylock since Jacob Isaac's.


Together with the benefit + privilege of said alley or passage with ingress egress + regress in through and by the same.

For Building and lot. West side 20 ft street or alley leading out of High Street into Elbow Lane - Front on High Street 34 ft. 4 ins - depth 150 ft. Bounded Southward with a 16 ft. alley, and Westward with ground later belonging to John Budd.

* This is the first deed record which has any mention of the 16" fat alley in rear of Anchor Inn 150 feet deep on Bank St. The Inn has always been part since building was erected on nos 12 & 13 Bank St (16' fat alley) by Dr. B. Rogers in his Estate.

No conveyance can be found of recently John Budd or his widow sole devisee under his will. The first deed bears the Seal & Release 1740 - Jacob Shoemaker Jr.
