that he has examined and is familiar with the
premises described in the foregoing Petition, to-wit, all
that certain Lot or piece of Ground, with the Messuages
or Tenements thereon erected, situate on the north side
of Locust Street in the City of Philadelphia, beginning
at a point twenty feet westward from the westerly
side of Juniper Street, thence extending northwardly
in a line parallel with said Juniper Street, sixty
feet, thence eastwardly in a line parallel with said
Locust Street twenty feet to the westerly line of said
Juniper Street, thence northwardly along the westerly
line of said Juniper Street one hundred and
twenty-four feet nine inches, thence westwardly in
a line at right angles with said Juniper Street fifty
feet, thence northward nine feet three inches, thence
westward in a line at right angles with said Juniper
Street fifty feet, to the easterly line of a fifty feet
wide court, thence southwardly along the easterly
line of said court seventeen feet, thence westwardly
partly across the end of said court twenty-five
feet to a point in a line with the westerly side
of said Sycamore Street, thence southwardly along
said line eighteen feet, thence eastward across the
head of said Sycamore Street fifteen feet to the
easterly line of said Sycamore Street, thence south-
wardly along the easterly line of said Sycamore
Street one hundred and fifty-nine feet to Locust
Street, thence eastwardly along the northerly line
of said Locust Street, ninety feet more or less to the
