






THE BATTLE GROUND IN THE VICINITY OF LEESBURG.

The above map will convey to the reader an accurate idea of the position of Leesburg, Harrison's Island, Edwards' Ferry, and the other important localities in the vicinity. The distance from Edwards' Ferry to Leesburg is about five miles; from Leesburg to Franklinville is the same distance; and from Leesburg to the Union Bridge about twenty-three miles. Leesburg is the capital of Loudon county, Virginia, and is situated near a granite called "Green
