On Sunday, the 19th, after sailing two or three hours southward and eastward, the *Altahroos* alighted a woman and five children, and were fetched up to what proved to be the *Eschastashes*, captured by the *Yukon* and *Dehcho* and given away to the *Yukon*. The *Eschastashes* were a party of a wife and five children and a negro looking exactly like the negroes of the *Eschastashes* to which she was taken.
