"Section 2. That immediately after passing this Act, the
 Governor shall be authorized and required to call for
 one Volunteer Company of Infantry from each Infantry
 Battalion, and to receive two Rifle Companies from each
 Infantry Brigade in the State, to consist of one Captain,
 one First Lieutenant, one Second Lieutenant, one Third
 Lieutenant, five Sergeants, six Corporals, and not less
 than sixty nor more than eighty-five privates, and such
 Company shall have preference in the order of accept-
 ance by the Governor over other Companies subsequently
 raised from such Battalions, or from the State at
 large. That every existing Volunteer Company, Troop,
 or Squadron, Battalion or Regiment, composed of volun-
 teer corps, which shall offer their services as a whole,
 may be so received and permitted to retain their offi-
 cers: Provided, They tender their services with the
 requisite number of officers, non-commissioned officers and
 privates. And if any Battalion of Infantry shall ne-
 glect, refuse, or fail, for want of numbers, for thirty days
 after the issue of the call of the Governor for the pur-
 poses aforesaid, to report to him the organization of such
 Volunteer Company or Companies, with their comple-
 ment of officers, non-commissioned officers and privates,
 ready for service, then the Governor is hereby
 authorized and required to fill such vacancies by re-
 ceiving volunteers from the nearest Battalion or Batta-
 lions to the one so failing; and to order a draft from
 such Battalions as refuse or neglect to tender the requi-
 site number of officers, non-commissioned officers, and
 sixty privates."

 You will forthwith order out the various Battalions
 composing your commands, and make a call for volun-
 teers, pursuant to and in accordance with the provision
 of the second section of an Act "to provide an armed
 military force," a copy of which I herewith transmit
 above.
 You will organize those who volunteer into companies,
 according to the section referred to above, and furnish
 this office with the name of every Company, the Batta-
 lion from which it is raised, and a complete list of its
 officers, non-commissioned officers, and privates.
 If volunteers in sufficient numbers are not tendered
 to comply with the Act above referred to, you will order
 a draft for such numbers as may be necessary to com-
 plete the organization of every corps.
