

if he be at the same time of a sober life and conversation and to receive the rents issues & profits of the premises and to dispose of them in the manner aforesaid. To hold the said Office during his life on the foregoing proviso, and if he shall behave himself well therein. And the said Trustees are desired to meet twice in the year at least, viz. Once in or about the month called March, and once in the month of September or oftener as there may be occasion, especially for appointing a Librarian, as also for enquiring into his conduct, and particularly to consider the prices of such books as shall from time to time be purchased; some Booksellers in London charging double for what the same Book may be bought of another; and therefore they are to make themselves particularly acquainted with the Characters of the Library Booksellers in that City, but in Books newly printed there is no great difference in their first value; as also yearly to compare the whole Library with its Catalogue, for which end the Librarian shall put and keep them constantly in good order, as by the said Draught in the said Testator's own hand writing may appear. And whereas by comparing the said Draught so far as the said Testator had wrote it, with the said cancelled Instrument the substance uses and Intents appear to be nearly the same the chief alterations being the names of the Trustees and the different fund to be established in support of the uses whence there is great reason to believe that had the Testator's health continued he would also have added in the said Draught and intended new Settlement the several other clauses contained in the said cancelled Instrument and Indorsement thereon or such parts thereof as are not comprized in the said Draught, which other clauses in the said cancelled Instrument not inserted in the draught but now conceived of use to show the intention of the said Testator are in the words following "AND under this further trust that the said Librarian or his Deputy, if it can be done with convenience shall procure some suitable person to lodge in the Chamber over the Library Room aforesaid. And under this further Trust that the ^{said} Librarian by himself or his sufficient Deputy shall give due attendance there on the seventh day in every Week (commonly called Saturday) from the third hour in the afternoon until the seventh hour following in Summer time and so long as one may see to read in Winter, to the end that all persons residing in this province who have been educated in Reading & Writing and more especially those who have any knowledge in the Latin tongue, or who study any of the mathematical sciences or Medicine, and by the Librarian's favour any other person or persons subject of the Crown of Great Britain may have free admittance on the days aforesaid or on any other day on which the Librarian may be prevailed on to attend, with liberty if it shall be desired of borrowing any of the said Books for the Time and under the Terms following viz. every volume in folio for the space of three Weeks every of those in quarto two weeks, and every of those in octavo, ^{for} One week. Provided always that each person so borrowing give his note to the Librarian for the time being acknowledging the receipt of the Book borrowed in a bound Book to be provided and kept for that purpose, with a promise therein contained not to abuse the Book borrowed or write therein except it be in correcting literal Errors, and that he will keep it under cover the whole time it shall be in his possession and not carry it out of the City aforesaid, and that he will return the same Book in ^{like} good order
