"as it was received and within the time for which it was borrowed. Under the
"penalty of double the sterling price of the said Book as it is valued in the mar-
"gin of the Catalogue aforesaid, or if the Book borrowed be a Lexicon or Dictionary
"consisting of more than one volume, or any other volume of Graviius, Gronovius,
"Salengre and Poleni's critical collections, or other Authors consisting of more than
"one volume the person borrowing in every such case shall give his Receipt and
"promisory note aforesaid for double the sum sterling of the whole sett or several
"Volumes of the aforesaid Books respectively as they are valued in the Catalogue
"aforesaid. Provided also that in every such case where the Librarian shall see
"any ground for suspicion he shall insist on an actual depositum in money
"or other equivalent for the Book or Books lent, to be valued as aforesaid. Unless the
"person who shall so apply to borrow be a descendant of any branch of the family
"of the said James Logan or the Husband of any one of them. In every of which
"cases if the Librarian for the time being shall think it fitting, or the Trustees a-
"foresaid shall direct the same each such person shall have the privilege of tak-
"ing out any two several Books at one time and for double the space herein
"before limited to other Persons, giving their receipts for the Books so borrowed in the
"manner first before mentioned. And under the further Trust & Confidence that
"they the said Trustees and the survivor & survivors of them and those who shall suc-
"ceed them in the said Trust take care that the Librarians herein before appointed
"and all others who shall succeed them in the said Office or place, as well in the
"purchase to be made of more Books in repairing the said Library Room and all
"other matters of moment concerning the said Library shall from time to time
"and at all times advise with and be governed by the directions of the Trustees
"aforesaid or a majority of them. And under such further Trust and confidence
"and subject to such alterations as the said James Logan the elder by any future
"writing to be signed & sealed by him in presence of two or more credible Witnesses
"shall at any time hereafter think fit to declare." And by an Indorsement on
the said cancelled Instrument all in the Testator's own hand writing it ap-
peared that the said Testator intended to allow any of his descendants or his near Rela-
tions the privilege of keeping a Book out of the Library or two Books at a time double
the time that is prescribed by the within written cancelled Instrument as also to any
other person double the time that is therein limited they and every of them giving
Receipts as therein directed, yet considering how subject Books are to be abused
or otherwise injured by being lent abroad, the Testator gave this further caution
that no books be lent out of the Library but on the strict Enjunction to own
Descendants or Relations to be very careful of them and duly to return them
them, and to no other person except those of merit & distinction that may be fully
dependes on for their skill and care in using a Book well, and by no means to
every pretender; and ordered a bound book in folio to be safely kept in the Library
to enter all such purchases as also the Grants from other Benefactors to the Library
therein. Now for the execution of the said Testator's intention concerning the
said Library appearing by his said Last Will and Codicil and by the said
Draught of his intended settlement and the several clauses in and upon the
said cancelled Instrument hereinbefore set forth so far only as appears consistent
with the said last Will and Draught. This Indenture Witnesseth that
