Resolved, that the Board of Trustees of the Loganian Library request that Mr Landolt will accept their grateful thanks for his valuable and disinterested services, and hope that he will consent to render them his efficient aid in the further settlement of their claim on the adjoining tract.

Resolved, that Messrs Logan, Morris & Williams name & appoint a committee to examine the accounts between this Institution and the Library Co.
