

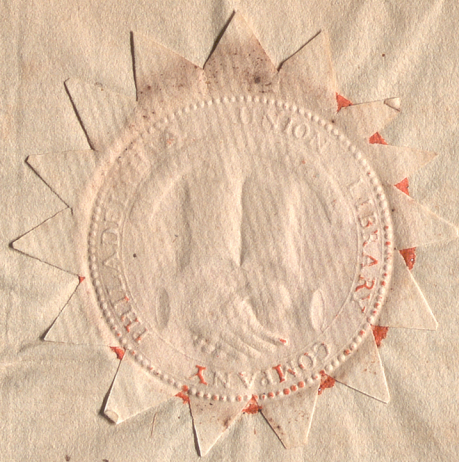

AND WHEREAS *John Wistar* of the *City of Philadelphia* Merchant hath made Application to the DIRECTORS of the said Company to be admitted a Member thereof, and hath been by them approved of: THEREFORE the said DIRECTORS do hereby certify, That, for and in Consideration of the Sum of Eight Pounds *in cash Books and Effects* paid into the Hands of *James Whiteall* the said Company's TREASURER, by the said *John Wistar* as *Receipt endorsed appears*, DO grant unto him the said *John Wistar* his Heirs and Assigns, TO HOLD, possess, and enjoy, for ever, one equal Share of the Books and Effects of the said Company, UNDER the Restrictions and Reservations of the said Charter, and conformable to the Laws and Ordinances of the said Company. 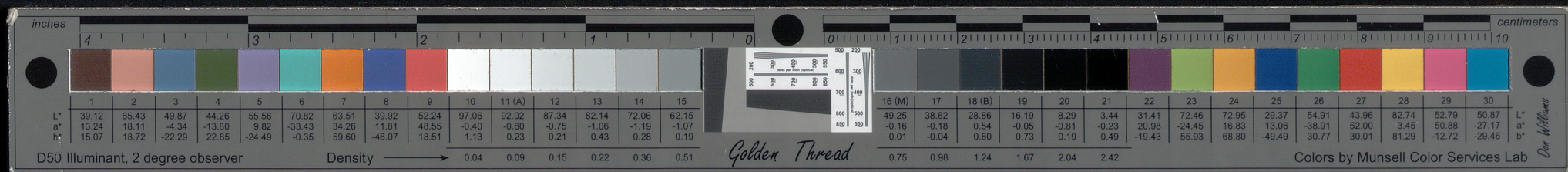
