his Heirs and Assigns, TO HOLD, possess, and enjoy, for ever, one equal Share

Reservations of the said Charter, and conformable to the Laws and Ordinances of

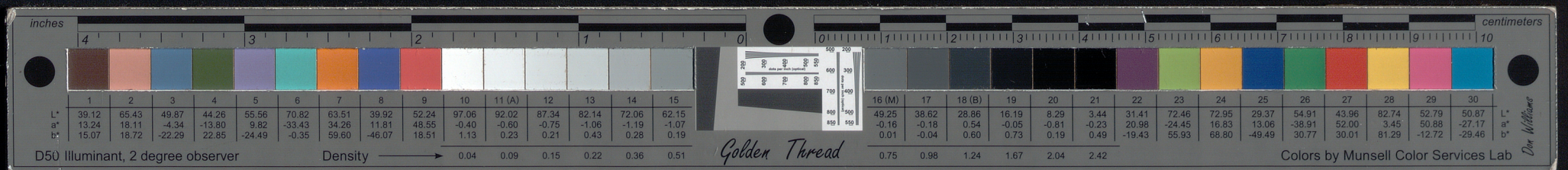
