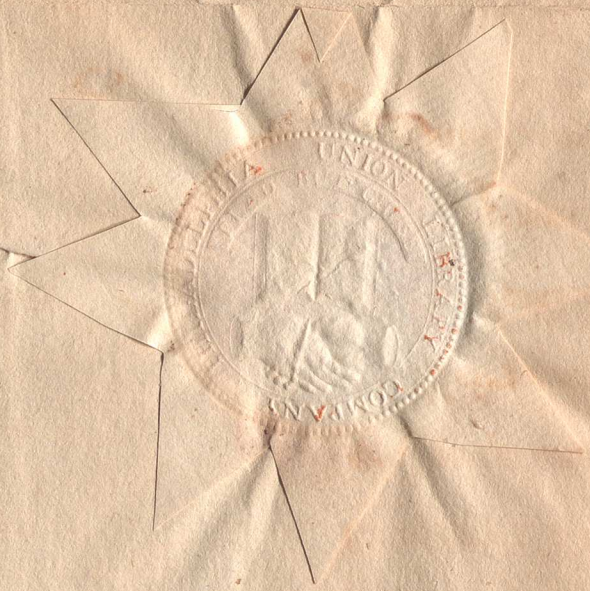


WHEREAS a CHARTER, under the great Seal of the Province of Pennsylvania, bearing Date the 6th Day of October, *Anno Domini 1759*, was granted by the Honourable WILLIAM DENNY, Esquire, to THE UNION LIBRARY COMPANY OF PHILADELPHIA, incorporating them into one Body Politick. AND WHEREAS *John Stagg* of the City of Philadelphia Painter & Glazier hath made Application to the DIRECTORS of the said Company to be admitted a Member thereof, and hath been by them approved of: THEREFORE the said DIRECTORS do hereby certify, That, for and in Consideration of the Sum of Eight Pounds (*in Cash, Books and Effects*) paid into the Hands of *James Whiteall* the said Company's TREASURER, by the said *John Stagg* as *& Receipt endorsed appears*, DO grant unto him the said *John Stagg* his Heirs and Assigns, TO HOLD, possess, and enjoy, for ever, one equal Share of the Books and Effects of the said Company, UNDER the Restrictions and Reservations of the said Charter, and conformable to the Laws and Ordinances of the said Company. Philadelphia, the *Sixth Day of February* 1769.
