Arrangements have been made with his Honor Mayor McMichael, for a sufficient detail of police to keep the streets upon which the procession forms, and through which it passes, entirely clear of vehicles of every description; and citizens will positively be required to remain on the sidewalks in order that no obstruction shall be offered to the column.

15. Military organizations throughout the State (including military schools) are cordially invited to participate in the ceremony, and requested to advise Col. P. C. Ellmaker, the Chairman of the sub-Committee, at once, in order that appropriate places may be assigned them.

16. The leaders of bands employed by the Committee will report at the City Armory, Broad, near Race street, on the morning of the Fourth, at eight o'clock, to the sub-Committee on Music, by whom places in the column will be assigned them.

17. The ceremony of the day will close with a grand display of fireworks, under the supervision of Professor Jackson, at Fairmount Park. The exhibition will commence at 8½ o'clock P. M.

18. Commanding officers of regiments late in the service of the United States are requested to furnish their Color Bearers and Guards who design participating in the ceremonies with such credentials as will satisfy the Committee, to whom they report, that they are authorized to receive the Colors and entitled to quarters and subsistence.

19. On the evening of the proposed celebration the citizens are requested to illuminate their dwellings and places of business.
