PROGRAMME OF THE CEREMONIES

ADOPTED BY THE

COMMITTEE OF ARRANGEMENTS.

1. The Color Bearers and Color Guards will be transported free of charge on the different railroads. On their arrival in this city they will report to the sub-committee, at the City Armory, Broad street, near Race, where the Colors will be deposited and the Guard relieved by a proper detail. The Committee will also be prepared to assign to the Color Bearers and Guards from the interior comfortable quarters during their stay in the city.

2. On the morning of the Fourth a procession will be formed under the direction of Major-General Winfield S. Hancock, on Broad street, the right resting on Arch street, at such hour as he may designate, in the following order:

Advance Guard.

Mounted Policemen.

BAND.

Henry Guards, Captain Spear.

Commanding Officer and Staff.

Mounted Officers not on Duty with Troops.

Band.

Dismounted Officers not on Duty with Troops.

Washington Artillery, of Pottsville.

National Light Infantry, of Pottsville.

Ringgold Light Artillery, of Reading.

Logan Guards, of Lewistown.

Allen Infantry, of Allentown.

These being the first troops to pass through Baltimore on their way to Washington, when the Capital was supposed to be in danger, at the commencement of the rebellion in 1861.
