Form on **BROAD STREET**, Right resting on **BROWN STREET**,  
Countermarch down Broad to Spring Garden, down Spring Garden to Twelfth, up Twelfth  
to Brown, down Brown to New Market, down New Market to Callowhill, up Callowhill to  
Second, down Second to Arch, up Arch to Third, down Third to Christian, up Christian to  
Ninth, up Ninth to South, up South to Nineteenth, up Nineteenth to Callowhill, down Cal-  
lowhill to Sixteenth, down Sixteenth to Vine, down Vine to Seventh, down Seventh to  
Arch, up Arch to Twelfth, down Twelfth to Market to National Hall, where the National  
Convention of the Workingmen will be held.
