## To the Members and Aids of Committees

In consideration of the great services which you are rendering to the Fair no restriction has been placed upon your tickets which admit to all the Departments, but as their indiscriminate use may materially interfere with the successful result of our united efforts, allow me to beg, as a personal favor, that your visits to the popular departments will be made at hours when they are least crowded, and that they, under no circumstances, will be used as lounging places. The Children's Exhibitions, gotten up for them especially, I may also hope will not be used to their exclusion.

I am sensible that to most of you this appeal is unnecessary, and I believe that all will respect it, for I do not doubt that a common purpose animates us all, and that every restraint that I place upon myself, you will cheerfully adopt.
