THEREAS it is conceived that great advantages may arise to the public, as well as to the individual members, by a union of the Library Companies aforefaid. BEIT ENACTED by the Library Company of Phi-Directors ladelphia, that their Directors for the time behave pow- ing, shall have full power and authority to admit the mem- the members of the Union Library Company; bers of the and that each member fo admitted, shall, by brary Com. virtue thereof, be entitled to an equal share of all the estate both real and personal, belonging to the faid Library Company of Philadelphia, in common with their other members; and shall receive accordingly certificates thereof. Provided always, That, previous thereto, the faid Union Library Company do affign over and convey all their estate, both real and perfonal, to the faid Library Company of Philadelphia, and deliver possession thereof to the Directors for the time being; subject nevertheless to all such contracts heretofore made and now subsisting between the faid Union Library Company and any of their members, as the faid Directors shall deem proper and expedient.
