And it is to be understood, that there be Releases in Deco, or express Releases, whereof Littleton here hath thewed an Example. These express Re= leafes mult of Mecedity be by Deed. There be also Releases 27 H. 8. 29. of an Use. in Law, and they are some= 34 H. 6. 44. of an Attaint. times by Deed, and sometimes without Deed. As if the Lozd disseise the Tenant, and maketh a Feofiment in Fee by Deed or without Deed, this is a Re=

Words, Relaxasse. Relaxasse. lease of the Deigniozy. And so it is, if the Wisseisee disseise the Heir of the Wisseisoz, and make a Feossment in Fee by Weed or without Deed, this is a Release in Law of the Right; and the same Law it is of a Right in Astion.

If the Obligee make the Obligoz his Executoz, this is a Release in Law of the Astion, but the Duty remains, for the which the Executor may retain to much Goods of the Te-

stato2. If the Feme Obligee take the Obligoz to Husband, this is a Release in Law. The like Law is, if there be two Femes Obligees, and the one take the Debtoz to Husband.

If an Infant of the Age of sebenteen Pears release a Webt, this is void. But if an Inkant make the Debtoz his Executoz, this is a good Release in Law of the Astion.

But if a Feme Executrix take the Debtoz to Husband, this is no Release in Law, for that should be a Mrong to the Wead, and in Law work a Devastavir, which an Ast in Law shall never work. And so it was adjudged in the King's Bench, Mich. 30 & 31 Eliz. in 50 E. 3. 24. 32 E. 3. Tir. which Case I was of Counsel.

But it is to be observed, That there is a Diversity between a Release in Deed and a Release in Law; for if the Heir of the Disseilor make a Lease for Like, and the Disseilee release his Right to the Lessee for his Like; his Right is gone for ever. But if the Wisselse doth disselfe the Heir of the Wisselfoz, and make a Lease foz Like, by this Release, in Law, the Right is released but during the Life of the Lessee: Foz a Release in Law shall be expounded moze kabourable, according to the Intent and Meaning of the Parties, than a Release
