that I believed flave-keeping to be a practice inconfistent with the christian religion: this in fome degree abated my uneafiness; yet, as often as I reflected feriously upon it, I thought I should have been clearer, if I had defired to be excused from it, as a thing against my conscience; for fuch it was. And some time after this, a young man, of our fociety, spoke to me to write a conveyance of a flave to him; he having lately taken a negro into his house: I told him, I was not eafy to write it; for, though many of our meeting and in other places kept flaves, I still believed the practice was not right; and defired to be excused from the writing. I spoke to him in good will; and he told me, that keeping flaves was not altogether agreeable to his mind; but that the flave being a gift made to his wife, he had accepted of her.
