a contrary disposition, their difficulties are

great at fuch a time.

Officers in great anxiety endeavouring to get troops to answer the demands of their fuperiors, feeing men, who are infincere, pretend scruple of conscience, in hopes of being excused from a dangerous employment, they are likely to be roughly handled. In this time of commotion fome of our young men left the parts, and tarried abroad till it was over; fome came, and proposed to go as foldiers; others appeared to have a real tender scruple in their minds against joining in wars, and were much humbled under the apprehension of a trial so near: I had conversation with several of them to my satisfaction. At the fet time when the captain came to town, some of those last-mentioned went and told him in fubstance as follows:-That they could not bear arms for consciencefake; nor could they hire any to go in their places, being refigned as to the event of it: at length the captain acquainted them all, that they might return home for the present, and required them to provide themselves as foldiers, and to be in readiness to march when called upon. This was fuch a time as I had not feen before; and yet I may fay, with thankfulness to the Lord, that I believed this trial was intended for our good; and I was favoured with refignation to him.
