opposition to real peace and happiness; and renders them enemies to the cross of Christ,

who fubmit to the influence of it."

"To keep a watchful eye towards real objects of charity, to visit the poor in their lonefome dwelling-places, to comfort them who, through the dispensations of Divine Providence, are in strait and painful circumstances in this life, and steadily to endeavour to honour God with our fubstance, from a real fense of the love of Christ influencing our minds thereto, is more likely to bring a bleffing to our children, and will afford more fatisfaction to a christian favoured with plenty, than an earnest desire to collect much wealth to leave behind us, for "here we have " no continuing city;" may we therefore diligently " feek one that is to come, whose " builder and maker is God."

"Finally, brethren, whatfoever things are true, whatfoever things are just, whatfoever things are ever things are pure, whatfoever things are lovely, whatfoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, if there be any praise, think on these things and do them, and the God of peace shall be

" with you."
