alone: and after fome hours, my heart being filled with the spirit of supplication, my prayers and tears were poured out before my heavenly Father, for his help and infruction in the manifold difficulties which attended me in life: and while I was waiting upon the Lord, there came a messenger from the women friends, who lodged at another house, defiring to confer with us about appointing a meeting, which to me appeared weighty, as we had been at fo many before; but after a thort conference, and advising with fome elderly friends, a meeting was appointed, in which the friend, who first moved it, and who had been much shut up before, was largely opened in the love of the gospel: and the next morning, about break of day, going again on board the veffel, we reached Falmouth on the Main before night; where our horses being brought, we proceeded toward Sandwich quarterly-meeting.

Being two days in going to Nantucket, and having been there once before, I observed many shoals in their bay, which make failing more dangerous, especially in stormy nights; also, that a great shoal, which encloses their harbour, prevents their going in with floops, except when the tide is up; waiting without which, for the rifing of the tide, is fometimes hazardous in storms: waiting within, they fometimes miss a fair wind. I took notice, that on that finall island was a great number of inhabitants, and the foil not very fertile; the timber fo gone,
