" his neighbour; and ye had made a covo-" nant before me, in the house which is call-" ed by my name; but ye turned, and pol-" luted my name, and caused every man his " fervant, whom he had fet at liberty at their " pleasure, to return, and brought them into subjection, to be unto you for servants. and for handmaids: therefore thus faith the Lord, ye have not hearkened unto me. " in proclaiming liberty every one to his " neighbour, and every one to his brother. " Behold, I proclaim liberty to you, faith the Lord, to the fword, to the pestilence, " and to the famine; and I will make you to be removed into all the kingdoms of the " earth.—The men who transgressed my covenant which they made, and passed be-"tween the parts of the calf, I will give in-" to the hands of their enemies, and their "dead bodies shall be for meat unto the " fowls of the heaven, and the beafts of the es earth."

Soon after this their city was taken and burnt; the king's fons and the princes flain; and the king, with the chief men of his kingdom, carried captive to Babylon.—Ezekiel, prophefying the return of that people to their own land, directs, "Ye fhall divide the land by lot, for an inheritance unto you, and to the ftrangers that fojourn amongft you; in what tribe the ftranger fojourns, there shall ye give him his inheritance, faith the Lord God."
