wants of his people as ever.

The prophet Isaiah, represents the unrighteous doings of the Israelites toward the poor, as the fruits of an effeminate life, " As " for my people, children are their oppreffors, and women rule over them; what " mean ye that ye beat my people to pieces, " and grind the faces of the poor, faith the " Lord God." Then he mentions the haughthress of the daughters of Sion, and enumerates many ornaments, as instances of their vanity, to uphold which, the poor were for hardly dealt with, that he fets forth their poverty, their leanness and inability to help themselves, in the similitude of a man maimed by violence or " beaten to pieces," and forced to endure the painful operation of having his face gradually worn away in the manner of grinding.

And I may here add, that at times, when I have felt true love open my heart towards my fellow creatures, and been engaged in weighty conversation in the cause of righte-ousness, the instructions I have received under these exercises, in regard to the true use of the outward gifts of God, have made deep

and lafting impressions on my mind.
