"flict such a punishment as was required, because of the defect "in that particular of the former established constitutions of her "kingdom, yet, with the unanimous consent of the parliament, " she had caused a new act to be passed, to serve as a law for the "future." This humiliating step was accepted as a full satisfaction by the czar; and the offenders, at his request, were difcharged from all farther profecution.

THIS statute a recites the arrest which had been made, "in "contempt of the protection granted by her majesty, contrary to "the law of nations, and in prejudice of the rights and privi-"leges, which embaffadors and other public ministers have at all "times been thereby possessed of, and ought to be kept sacred "and inviolable:" wherefore it enacts, that for the future all process whereby the person of any embassador, or of his domestic or domestic servant, may be arrested, or his goods distreined or feifed, shall be utterly null and void; and the persons prosecuting, soliciting, or executing such process shall be deemed violaters of the law of nations, and disturbers of the public repose; and shall fuffer such penalties and corporal punishments as the lord chancellor and the two chief justices, or any two of them, shall think fit. But it is expressly provided, that no trader, within the description of the bankrupt laws, who shall be in the service of any embassador, shall be privileged or protected by this act; nor shall any one be punished for arresting an embassador's servant, unless his name be registred with the secretary of state, and by him transmitted to the sheriffs of London and Middlesex. Exceptions, that are strictly conformable to the rights of embassadors, as observed in the most civilized countries. And, in consequence of this statute, thus declaring and enforcing the law of nations,
