paid A P give Money for keeping of his Castle, if he himself will do it in his proper Person, or cause it to be done by another sufficient Man, if he may not do it himself for a reasonable cause. (2.) And if we do lead or send him in an Army, he shall be free from Castle-ward for the time that he shall be with Us in Fee in our Host, for the which he hath done Service in the Wars. (i. e.) He shall pay nothing towards the Maintenance of those who watch and ward in the Castle.

CHAP. XXII.

Taking of Horses, Carts, and Woods.

O Sheriff nor Bayliff of ours, nor any other, shall take the Horses or Carts of any Man to make Carriage, except he pay the old price limited, that is to say, for Carriage with two Horses, id. a day. (2.) No demesse Cart of any spiritual Person or Knight, or any Lord, shall be taken by our Bailiss. (3.) Nor we, nor our Bailiss, not any other shall take any Man's Wood for our Castle, or other our Necessaries to be done, but by the License of him whose the Wood is.
