
C H A P. II.

Nothing shall be purveyed to the King's Use, without the Owners Consent.

NO Officer of ours, or of our Heirs, shall take Corn, Leather, Cattle, or any other Goods, of any manner of Person, without the Good-will and Assent of the Party to whom the Goods belonged.

C H A P. III.

Nothing shall be taken of Sacks of Wooll, by Colour of Maletot.

Nothing from henceforth shall be taken of Sacks of Wooll, by Colour, or Occasion of Maletot.

C H A P. IV.

All Laws, Liberties, and Customs, confirmed.

WE will and grant, for Us and our Heirs. that all Clerks and Lay-men of our Land shall have their Laws, Liberties, and free Customs, as largely and wholly, as they have used to have the same at any time when they had them. (2.) And if any Statutes have been made by Us and our Ancestors, or any Customs brought in contrary to them, or any manner of Article contained in this present Charter : We will and grant, that
