that night!!

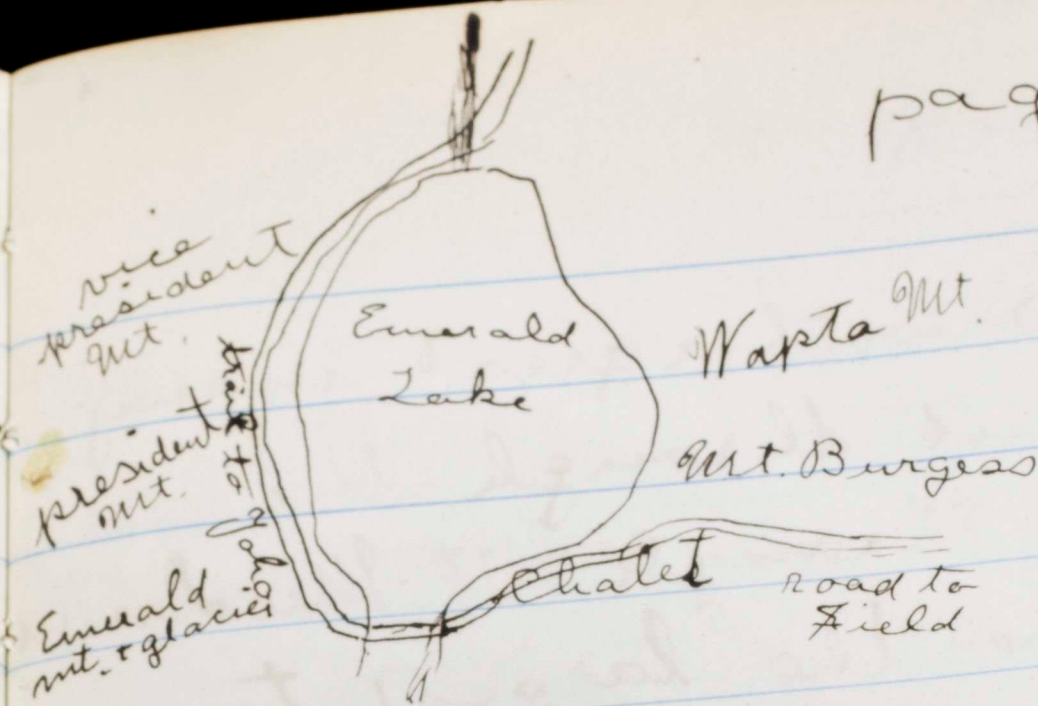
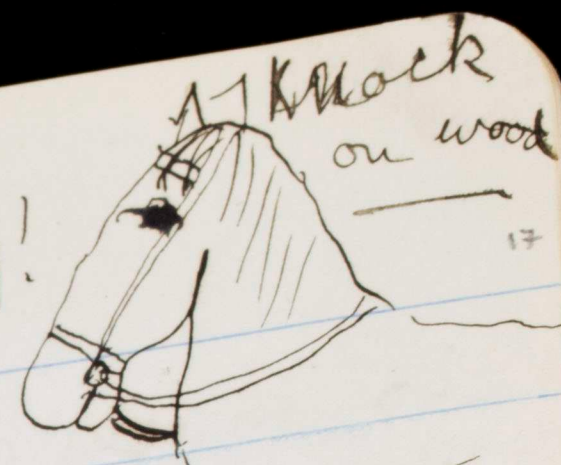
Fri. July 29th

heard some loons, swimming across.



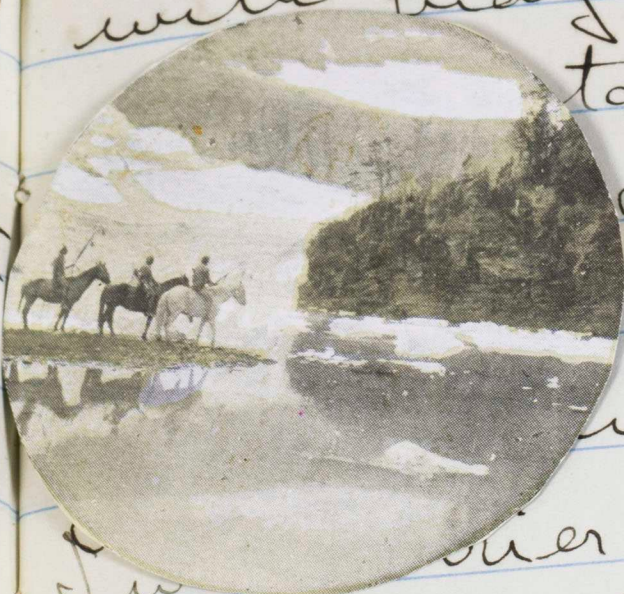
Emerald Lake
