

upon the same practice, as hath been by your Grace done. And
doe likewise require you to give order for the removal
of the Nobles in such manner as shall seeme most
expedient unto you, and may best stand wth the Rules of
the Parliament, and the publique good of thes^e Kingdomes.

8 And further whereas we are informed, that Divers of the
Ponderators, specially those of the Scottish Nation doe
marry wth the Irish: By w^{ch} marriages, and Inter-marriages
it cannot bee avoided, but that they will Inter-mixe, and
in a short time become altogether Irish: Now doe hereby
require you to restrain all Ponderators of w^{ch} ever Scottish
or English from marrying wth the Irish: And that
Commandment herein bee strictly observed for the future,
upon such punishment as is due: so that you shall conforme
to Royall pleasure: And that you call before you such as
have already offended herein, and reprove them severely for
the same, until order may bee taken for their further
punishment.

9 And whereas we are given to understand, that Robert
Stuart hath professed the Oath of Supremacie; and
that George Hamilton is a Trusant Papist: Now
doe hereby require you to take notice hereof. And calling
them before you, and the rest of the Councell here, if they
shall not reforme themselves as is meete: they one by
takinge the Oath of 2^d Eliz: and the other by
takinge the said oath, and renouncing the Oath according
to the Lawes of the Realme: so remove them both out of
the Kingdom.

10 And doe hereby also require you to tender the said Oath of
2^d Eliz: unto all the Scottish Ponderators, and their Ponder
Commanders, and to all the Scottish Bishops, unto whom Lands
have bin assigned, and whose w^{ch} have since acquired
the same
