

"All the species of *Fuchsia* droop their heads toward the ground in such a manner, that their inner beauties can only be discerned when they are somewhat above the eye of the spectator."

In a meaner flower this might not attract attention, but most of the *fuchsias* are eminently beautiful, both in form and color; and this modest bending of the head is the more remarked from the singular and peculiar beauty of the parts involved in the calyx, which they would thus seem anxious to conceal." Beautifully and significantly typifying modesty.
