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Isaac Pearson having damaged the first volume of "Hume's History of England, of a sett of two vols. N^o 139, the Board agree, that he shall either pay for damage done, four pounds and take the 2nd Volume, or pay a fine of thirty shillings for the damage done. And for his damaging one volume of two, of the "Beauties of the Magazines," it is agreed, that he shall pay two dollars and take the 2nd. Volume, or replace them with a new sett. In his compliance he is permitted to have the full use of his share.

John Mifflin, junior, having lost one volume of the "Critical Review," N^o 45th, which he took out on his father's share, March 1782. It is agreed he shall pay thirty-five shillings; on compliance the use of the share is to be restored. In reconsidering this case, the Committee are of opinion, that the use of the share may be restored, on his replacing the volume lost.

Benj. Gibbs, Benj. Pultney and John Rainger the Committee, met, and agreed, that Edward Burd be fined one shilling for damaging the title page of the first volume of Fielding's works.
