

ing Ten shillings to the Librarian, and the latter paying eleven shillings and three pence to the same for the use of the Library, that the said sums be accepted as a full satisfaction for the fines on said books, and the respective persons above mentioned be permitted the use of their shares.

Doctor Davidson having incurred certain fines and book-hire, to the amount of £2² 2⁶ through the default of a person to whom he trusted the use of Edward Middleton's share, by reason whereof he has paid three annual payments without having had the use of the share: The Committee with the concurrence of the Board of Managers, in consideration of the hardship of the case, as well as the poverty of the person who occasioned the loss, agree to restore the use of the share on his paying three dollars, which will be received in full compensation.
