- a Philosophy: general and miscellaneous works. (See I c.)
 - 1. History of philosophy. Philosophical dictionaries.
- b Cyclopedias and dictionaries of arts and sciences. Collections of useful knowledge.
 - 1. French, German, etc.
- c Metaphysics. Psychology. (See I a.)
- d Physiognomy and Phrenology. Temperaments.
- e Occult philosophy. Prophecies other than Biblical. Swedenborg and his works. The future life considered apart from Revelation. (See A q 1, U i.)
 - 1. Alchemy.
 - 2. Astrology and palmistry; fortune telling; oneiromancy.
 - 3. Demonology; witchcraft; apparitions; hallucinations; stigmata.
 - 4. Modern Spiritualism; mesmerism; somnambulism; dreams; sleep. *hypnotism*
- f Logic.
- g Moral philosophy; Ethics.
 - 1. Ethical treatises on the Passions, Virtues, Vices, ~~Peace~~, Solitude, Happiness, Suicide, etc. *+ Peace and war*
 - 2. Marriage and the condition, duties, and rights of women; sex in nature, the family. (See E l.) *Divorce*
 - 3. Etiquette, courtesy, the character of a gentleman. (See U h.)
 - 4. Casuistry, Christian morals. Cruelty to children and animals. Vivisection.
 - 5. Temperance. Prohibitory and license laws. (See I n 2 +.) *Periodicals, Temperance Societies and Asylums*
 - 6. Lotteries and gambling.
- h Education. *Periodicals, general & miscellaneous lectures, Periodicals & transactions, College Societies, History of the temperance movement*
 - 1. Elementary works for youth. (See O f 2 +.)
 - 2. Universities, Colleges, Military and Naval Academies, Theological, Industrial, and Common Schools. U. S. and State Reports. (See I n 9, U y 7 +, U y 8.) *Art, Business, Charity, U.S.,*
 - 3. Instruction for the blind, deaf, etc. (See I i 7, I n 8.)
 - 4. Self-culture. Debating societies and reading clubs. *accidents & their treatment, arbitration & conciliation, bank notes & counterfeits*
- i Government and politics, general treatises; histories.
 - 1. Political economy, population, pauperism, wages, labor, strikes, co-operation, communism, socialism. *Protection & free trade*
 - 2. Money, the precious metals, mints, finance, banks, investments, usury, interest tables, paper credit, national debts, taxation. (See U p 5 + U y 7 Δ.) *continental, colonial, French, confederate & other paper money (when collected by other nations, etc.)*
