

2. The current magazines and periodicals of a scientific and literary character will be provided.

3. Special accommodations for ladies, with a sitting-room, are arranged.

4. The Library will, as soon as practicable, be open in the evening to readers.

5. Annual subscriptions will be allowed for the future at fixed rates, as new shares can not be issued by the company.

6. An arrangement is contemplated by which books can be delivered to members and subscribers at their homes, free of cost.

7. Separate accounts for members and subscribers will be kept at both branches, with somewhat similar privileges as to the number of books to be taken out on each.

8. Facilities to students of Art will be offered in the use of books on that subject, of which the Library has an increasing number.

9. The new building will be connected by telephone with the Ridgway branch, and the interchange of books between the two will be effected in a more speedy way than at present.
