George Washington born, February 22, 1732.

Colonel Washington appointed Commander-in-chief of the American Army, June 14, 1775.

Boston evacuated by the British Army, March 17, 1776.

Battle of Brooklyn, August 27, 1776.

American Army withdraw from Long Island, August 28-29, 1776.

Battle of White Plains, October 25, 1776.

Battle of Trenton, December 26, 1776.


Battle of Princeton, January 3, 1777.

Battle of Brandywine, September 11, 1777.

Battle of Germantown, October 4, 1777.

Surrender of Lord Cornwallis at Yorktown, Oct. 19, 1781.

Treaty of Peace between Great Britain and United States, signed Nov. 1783.



General Washington resigns his commission as Commander-in-chief of the American Army, December 23, 1783.

General Washington unanimously chosen President of the Convention for framing a new Constitution for the United States, convened at Philadelphia, May, 1787.

General Washington elected President of the United States, to serve for four years from March 4, 1789. Inaugurated at New York, April 30, 1789.

General Washington again elected President of the United States, to serve for four years from March 4, 1793.

General Washington a second time appointed Commander-in-chief of the American Army, July, 1799, in anticipation of a war with France.

General Washington died, December 14, 1799.
