

on the first floor entirely to maps, of which in some departments our collection is the best outside of the British Museum. Our set of Phila. ^{for example} maps is practically complete, and that of Pennsylvania attases and maps nearly so. I ask permission to have a case put up in that room for the accommodation of maps on rollers, and also to have shelves made for attases &c. The total cost will be about \$100. -, the janitor doing the work.

Also to have the counter and the green table in the main hall covered with ^{leather or} imitation leather, in order to save wear and tear of books. This is a matter in regard to which the British Museum is very particular, as it is a great saving of bindings. The cost would be about \$50. - to \$75. - Plan enclosed.

Also I ask permission to bind a number of illustrated maps in numbers forming part of Dr. Rush's library. The cost would be about \$25. -

Since the last Report articles of Mr. Rush's furniture have been sold to the amt. of \$765 - making a total of \$2918. - There remain to be sold \$1,932. - Reserved by committee \$375. - Total inventory & appraisement \$5,225. -

The work of making a drain for the Janitor's House is going on.

The contractor has not yet begun caulking the joints of the platform, doubtless owing to the weather.
