


Report to Executive Committee.
Mrs Hutchinson & Platt.

I enclose a petition from Rufusford Samuel, Assistant at the Ridgway Branch, for an increase of salary. I trust the Committee will consider his case, bearing in mind that he is engaged to be married, and that his steadiness and faithfulness are remarkable. His manners leave something to be desired, but on the whole his knowledge of books and industry make him a valuable assistant.

I do not like his pressing the matter of an increase of salary, which is contrary to all the traditions of the Library. Mr. Abbot, for example, who has been in the service of the Co. for 18 years, has never asked for an increase, ~~and has had none for many years~~, though ~~I think he deserves it~~. He has shown during the past year exceptional executive ability, having had entire charge of the details of the Library work at Locust & Juniper Streets. He has an increasing family, and I know his salary (\$1800.) barely suffices for him to live.


When, about two years ago, the salaries of the




Lodwaran and his assistants were reduced, it was understood by them to be a temporary measure, necessary in consequence of the condition of the ledgers; and Mr. Wharton assured me more than once than, when the stringency was over, they should be restored to their former figures.

I respectfully suggest that the whole matter be referred to a Committee.

I enclose a revised estimate of the cost of a verandah running the whole length of the Building, amounting without the proposed wings to £ 1064. - ; and in my Report to the Finance Committee I have suggested that, being a permanent improvement, it might properly be paid for out of the proceeds of a U. S. Bond for £ 1000. - 6s of 1881 which will be paid off July 1st, belonging to the Company.

The janitor was not satisfied with the coal furnished him during the early part of the season for the Library furnaces, and when it was exhausted I allowed him to get a few tons & suit himself. He got them from Adams & Stone and is entirely satisfied. They offer to supply the Library for next winter at \$6.25 per ton.

Barker & Co. are now at work on the platform. This work is already paid for.

The janitor reports the tin roof in perfect order, and I have paid the contractor \$25 - on account as agreed. Some water, however, in heavy storms, soaks through the joints of the cornice, at the corners of the





roof, where the stone has been cut away to make room for the pipes. It can be remedied for about £35., which I ask permission to have done.

Bunford Samuel has applied again in writing for an increase of salary, which is certainly low £400., considering his ability and services; but there are other employees of the Co who have not petitioned for an increase, whose case is perhaps as deserving of consideration as his; and I have therefore laid the whole subject before the Executive Committee, suggesting that the ~~whole subject~~ ^{matter} might be referred to a Special or Standing Committee.
