1891	February	7	Saturday	Rain	Home all day. Swept the parlor, boys here in evening, a fine time. New gloves.
1891	February	8	Sunday	Cloudy	Church all day. Answered H.C.M’s letter. Inez’s in afternoon. Boys here in evening.
1891	February	9	Monday	Rain	Up to Capp’s, a fine time. Tom Dorsey came home with me. Blanch Songow went away.
1891	February	10	Tuesday	[Nothing recorded]	Millinery class and dancing school with T. Dorsey. A fine time. Retired 12:30 P.M.

1891	February	12	Thursday	[Nothing recorded]	Home all evening. A letter from Mabel. Will Holden here in evening. A pleasant evening. Retired 11 P.M.
1891	February	13	Friday	[Nothing recorded]	Swept our room, sewed rest of day. Church in evening. Mortimer’s afterwards. Retired 11:30 P.M
1891	February	14	Saturday	[Nothing recorded]	Choir rehearsal this evening. A fine day. St. Valentine’s day.
1891	February	15	Sunday	[Nothing recorded]	Engagement with Capps to see Helen Johnson. Did not go to Helen’s. Up to Addie’s house. Church in evening.
1891	February	16	Monday	[Nothing recorded]	Home all morning. Up to Dude’s in afternoon. Will Holden here in evening. Retired early.
1891	February	17	Tuesday	[Nothing recorded]	Millinery class every Tuesday from 7 to 9 P.M. My time changed to Thursday nights.
