The most superficial player will understand that a "Requiem" demands very different treatment from any other kind of Composition of but the author thinks it appropriate to give his ideas in composing. The Anado Solemento, page 3, conveys the news of a hero's death in the midst of battle: the Largo, pages 4 and 5, suggests the removal of the body off the field: the Pourcoso, page 6, the procession to a church or chapel near by: the Religioso, pages 7 and 8, the services at the chapel, with tolling bells and choral lamentation: the Bulliary, page 9, the wild grief on the way to the grave: and the Andrew the Company of the body into the tomb, with the muffled drum, and the departure of the people, as the music slovely dies away
