

SHIP HOUSE, GERMANTOWN.

This specimen of an old fashioned mansion is upon the Main Street of Germantown, and, although now plastered over on the outside, is evidently not a modern building. Upon the southeastern side of the house is a ship under sail carved in relief. In honor of the centennial year, it is to be presumed, this representation has been brought out in bright colors, the stars and stripes flying in all their glory. This property was formerly an inn, and was once occupied by George Peters, of the Peter's family, well-known in Philadelphia as stage proprietors. The date of its erection is uncertain.
