This house was sold May 7. 1825. -
Recorded in Deed Book. S. W. R. No 7.
Page 648.

The next house purchased was on the West side of Second Street, above Spruce street. Old No. 148. South 2nd Street, Now No. 264. South Second Street. Deed dated December 11th, 1824. Recorded in Deed Book S. W. R. No. 6. Page 15.

The purchase included two lots, and two dwelling houses on 2nd St, Store-house on Laurel Street, and Coach-House and Stable on same street.
