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- No. 1. Penn'a R. R. Station, "WAYNE"—at the 14 mile stone—with adjoining cottage, the latter now being the residence of Mrs. Jane Kissick, whose late husband, (John Kissick,) and Fred'k Grieff, were Engineers of the Old Centre Square Water Works, as well as of the present works at Fairmount, Philadelphia.
- No. 2. The Mansion as seen from the S. W. The Elevation in front contains the Gas Retorts that supply the building with Gas. (A man standing at the entrance.) A partial view of Grounds to the N. E.
- No. 3. View from the N. W., taken at the Station, presenting north side of Mansion. The old Water Reservoir with Flag Staff to the right, (East.)
- No. 4. Entire northern side of Mansion, (fronting on the Rail Road,) with Lawn, Fountain, Drives, etc. In the background, the South, are seen the ploughed fields beyond the Lancaster Pike.
- No. 5. Full front view taken from the South, and as fronting on "The Pike," at the 13 mile stone, with Conservatory, Green House, Flower Garden, etc. This main building, as well as the surrounding improvements, were laid out and completed in 1866—1867; the time occupied in erection being one year, less two days.
- No. 6. Main Entrance and Vestibule, taken from the interior, showing in the ornamented and ground glass of the vestibule doors, reflections of the flower vases on the terrace beyond them. A work of art.
- No. 7. Scenery and Grounds, and Summer House, east of Dwelling. To the left, partial views of the Old Water Reservoir, etc., with the former residence of Mr. A. to the right.
