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- No. 19. View from the N. W. of the old "Jno. Richards Manor House," built in 1792; probably the only remaining dwelling of the Richards family, who emigrated from Wales in 1687, and settled in Radnor, and who purchased directly from Wm. Penn about 3000 acres in this neighborhood. Their last lineal descendant and heir, Enoch Richards, died on the adjoining property in 1867, aged 88 years. He was born upon the farm and passed 82 years of his life upon it.
- No. 20. Northern view of the Sheep Houses, Fold, etc. with country to the south, as seen from the old Lancaster Road.
- No. 21. Two Cottages "built on a hill," south of the Pike, on a line with the Mansion. From them a prominent and magnificent scene is displayed of the surrounding country, Mansion, Rail Road, and adjoining properties for a great distance.
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
